Significance: Dowhait's Bridge is a 264-foot steel, pin-connected
Pratt through truss, composed of two spans. The
bridge is one of 38 Pratt through trusses recorded in
the Georgia Historic Bridge Survey. It is one of 30
that is pin-connected and one of only four Pratt
through trusses in the State that is composed of two
spans.

Project Information: This documentation project was undertaken in 1982 as a
mitigative measure by the Georgia Department of
Transportation, in accordance with a memorandum of
agreement to document the structure prior to
demolition.
