## **Summary Statement:**

Dean's Road Bridge is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places as a significantly intact example of a single-span Pratt eyebar through-truss bridge built in 1904. It crosses the Croton River/Muscoot Reservoir between the towns of Somers and North Salem in Westchester County. A concrete-filled grating deck and stringers were installed in 1954. Although it retains a high degree of architectural integrity, it has deteriorated and has been closed for several years.
