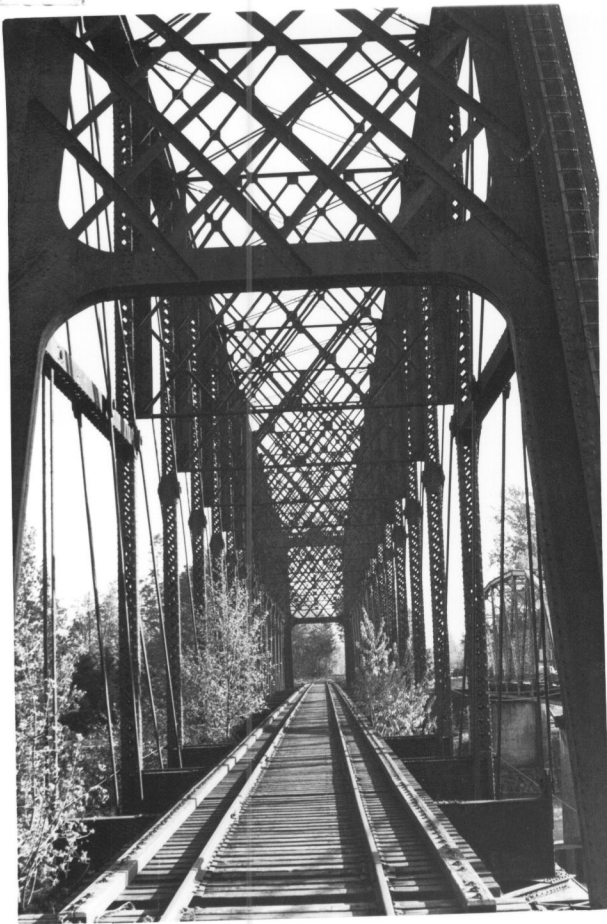

historical significance:

This bridge bears the date 1887. It was erected in that year at the mouth of the John Day River where the railroad crossed the stream on the south bank of the Columbia River. The bridge is made of wrought iron and is probably the only one of its type remaining in Oregon. It was moved at some later date to the McKenzie River site.
